Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Directors of Voith Paper Fabrics India Limited Report on the audit of the Annual Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying annual financial results of Voith Paper Fabrics India Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for the year ended 31 March 2025, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid annual financial results:

- a. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
